Three Bids Opened for Pond

By Mark Smucker Three bids in the amounts of \$58,204, \$49,615 and \$39,-924 were opened for construction of the pond at the

proposed Kewaskum Kiwanis Park on Monday by Jim Arthur, of Arthur and Associates of Fond du Lac, the architects for the project.

The low bid, which was received from Washkodiak Grading of Green Lake, allowed for a starting date of 60 days from the awarding of the contract, with completion of the entire job in 100 days. It was divided into five sub-bids as follows: 10,420 cubic yards of excavation for \$8,500, 5,500 tons of sand for just under \$13,000, 160' of overflow pipe for \$1,920, 168' of drain pipe with a manhole and valve for \$2,-520, and a plastic pond liner for the entire bottom in the amount of \$14,125.

The two other bids were submitted by Arthur Duehning and Sons of Slinger and Stoppleworth Excavation of Oakfield.

The park committee is

still considering the possibility of purchasing silica sand from Berlin, which would eliminate the bid for sand. In addition, the silica sand is heavier, which would mean that it would settle to the bottom better and stay there, which would keep the water clearer.

A total of 13 contractors took out specifications from the architect, and only three submitted bids. Mr. Arthur stated that the number of bids that are usually returned "Depends on how much work everybody has. Sometimes you get 0% and sometimes 100%." He presently has the bids at his office in Fond du Lac, where they will be rechecked to make sure that they are in order.

The architects will return with preliminary plans for the rest of the park on Aug. 2, and will have the detailed maps necessary to get state approval for the pond by August 16, the board's second meeting next month. Dan Schmidt, head of the park (Continued on Page 10)

Samples Show Water at Beach Is Best Ever

Water samples returned from the Division of Health in Madison show that the water in the Milwaukee river at the present Kewaskum village park has a fecal coli count of 60, the best ever.

There had been a change in the way that the samples were taken, since Madison wanted all samples packed in ice and sent in insulated envelopes. This latest one was the first one that was iced, and it was better than any sample sent in in the

Commissioner Bill Martin described the results as showing that "the water isn't too bar," and noted that a count of 200 or more over a period of time would indicate that the water was probably unsafe for swimming, according to state guidelines. "We are running well under 100," he

Meilahn Paints Chief Kewaskum

KEWASKUM, July 19 - "I am an unconventional artist in that I am conventional," commented Dan Meilahn, painter of the portrait of Chief Kewaskum that was recently

unveiled for the first time.
"I like to relate art to comon people. I try to paint things that would be for public display that are easily under-stood. You will never find one of my works in an art gallery because I feel that art shouldn't be isolated in them.'

He began thinking about the idea of doing a painting of Chief Kewaskum in June 1975 when his mother, Mrs. Ada Meilahn, mentioned the idea to a member of the Kewaskum Bicentennial Com-

It was not a simple matter to begin a painting of that however. Before the brush could be put to the canvas, there was a great deal

of research to be done. It was necessary to learn as much as possible about his subject, so Dan got several books that mentioned the Chief, and did some checking of his own into the places where he might have lived. Following this, the next step was a trip to the Milwaukee Public Museum to see the actual dress of the Woodland Indians, and to take some pictures for future reference. Finally, after he learned as much as was necessary about the Potawatomi tribe's religion, dress, and beliefs, the actual painting was begun in April 1976

After making preliminary sketches and discussing them with the Bicentennial Committee, he began painting the portrait, which was just re-cently completed. The finished acrylic painting is on display at Village Hall though he

Village Board Halts Building Permits in Ideal Subdivision

By Mark Smucker By a 6-1 vote, the Kewaskum Village Board voted not to approve any future

building permits in the Ideal subdivision on the recommendation of their attorney, Roger McKenna. Board President Charles Miller received a letter from the village's engineers, Robinson and Associates, stating that there were seven violations of the village's subdivision ordinance that have not been complied with, including manholes installed improperly, improper street preparation, failure to provide fill for the curbing, and failure to seed or sod the six feet of property next to the curbing.

A building permit would have been issued to David Sarauer of Kewaskum, who has already sold his present home and is living in an apartment until a new one can be built. Trustee Raynor Herriges noted that by denying all future permits, "The only one who is going to be hurt is Dave Sarauer." All of the other trustees except Greg Nigh expressed similar opinions, as he felt that "Since we are paying an attorney \$35 an hour, why go against his recommendations."

A motion to deny this and all future building permits in that area until an agreement can be reached was passed, with Dave Nigh voting against it. The possibility of granting Mr. Sarauer a waiv-

er due to hardship was discussed, and was not ruled out, as an answer to the problem for him.

An ordinance rezoning the land recently annexed into the village that is owned by Dr.'s Cesar and Aurora Sison was unanimously approved, following a public hearing where no opposition was offered to the proposal. It was formerly zoned agricultural and will now be usable for businesses which will allow them to build a clinic and drug store on it. The project had the approval of the plan commission prior to its approval, but no plans for the clinic have been drawn up at present.

Two bids were received for asphalt paying for Werner Drive, the lower one being \$2.59 per square yard from Payne and Dolan. Both bids were referred to committee for examination before a final decision is reached.

A sewer jet rodder bid of \$9,440 from Bark River Culvert and Equipment Co. of Milwaukee was accepted, providing that there are sufficient funds available for it. The bid that was accepted is \$3 higher than the lowest one, but Supt. of Public Works Augie Bilgo felt that it was definitely a better ma-

Tavern licenses for Linda and Cynthia Martin were approved, following a public hearing at which no opposition was offered.

committee, noted that the plans will be hand-carried to Madison to get their approval, and said jokingly that they would also hand-carry the permit back

Prior to the meeting, plans for the bath house and revised plans for the rest of the park were studied, and the necessary corrections were made to them. There will be two softball diamonds, 120' apart, so that someday they can be lighted with a minimum number of lights. In the future, there will be a limited amount of parking right next to the diamonds, but exactly how much could not be determined at this time. The horseshoe pits and the tennis courts will both be lighted, while the present plans show the tennis courts constructed out of asphalt, which is relatively inexpensive.

As for the bath house, it will have a brick face, which will be provided by the Kewaskum Bicentennial Committee, and will have cedar boards nailed vertically on the sides and back.

Only the central portion will be roofed, which will house the shower and toilet facilities, along with a first aid room and a multi-purpose room, which will be used as a warming house for ice skaters during the winter. The men and women will have separate basket checkers on each side of the building, which will also be roofed, but the dressing areas will not be covered, since the state discourages this. Enough sanitary facilities will be provided for up to 400 patrons, as established by the state.

The multi-purpose room will measure 12' x 161/2' and will have portable benches in it for the ice skaters to use during the winter. The entire central area that is roofed will be heated, but no decision has been reached as to what type of heating system will be installed.

Approximately 100 hours of painting were necessary complete the job, not including countless hours research. It shows Chief Kewaskum with his hand extended in a gesture of welcome, standing on top of a wooded hill, designed from photographs of a hill located south of the village, that some believe is the site of "Indian Since Kewaskum was a member of the Bear clan, there is a bear hidden in the foliage in the background, and he is shown wearing a bear's claw necklace. On the opposite side from the bear is an oak tree, which provides balance, and has a symbolism of its own, as the acorn was an important part of the ceremonial bag used by the Bear Clan.

When Dan graduated from Kewaskum High School in the

late '60s, there were no art classes at the high school level. Not discouraged, he went to University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee intending to major in art, but transferred to the University of Wisconsin and finished his studies in 1970. He received his degree in 1973, graduating with honors, with a bachelor of science in art. Last fall, he went back to school as a special student to earn enough teaching credits to obtain his certification as an art teacher. He is working for the village summer recreation program as head lifeguard and

is looking for a teaching position for this fall.

Meilahn also did the prelimiary work on the grand-stand at the elementary school, so that some of the younger artists in the village could paint a baseball scene on it. Dan has judged at the annual high school Fine Arts Festival for the past four years, and when he is not helping the village or a business that needs his services, he still finds time to do an occasional painting for himself or just relax.






