

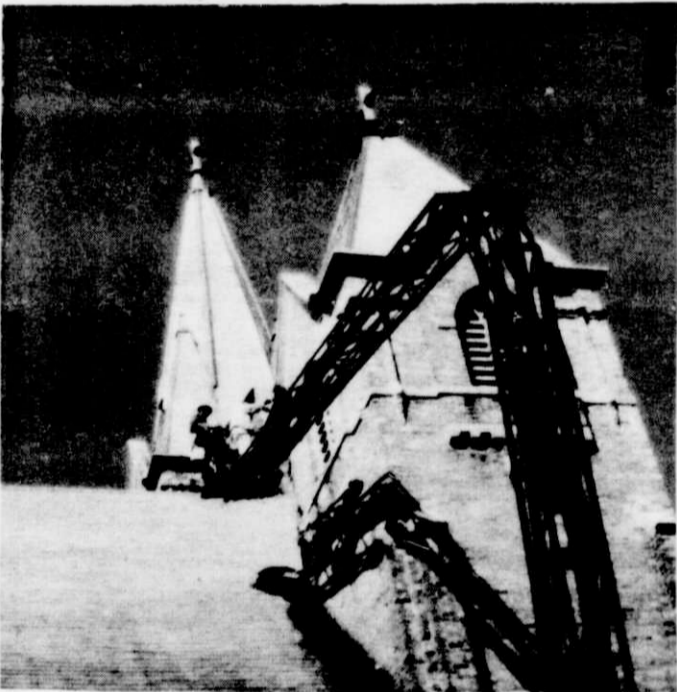
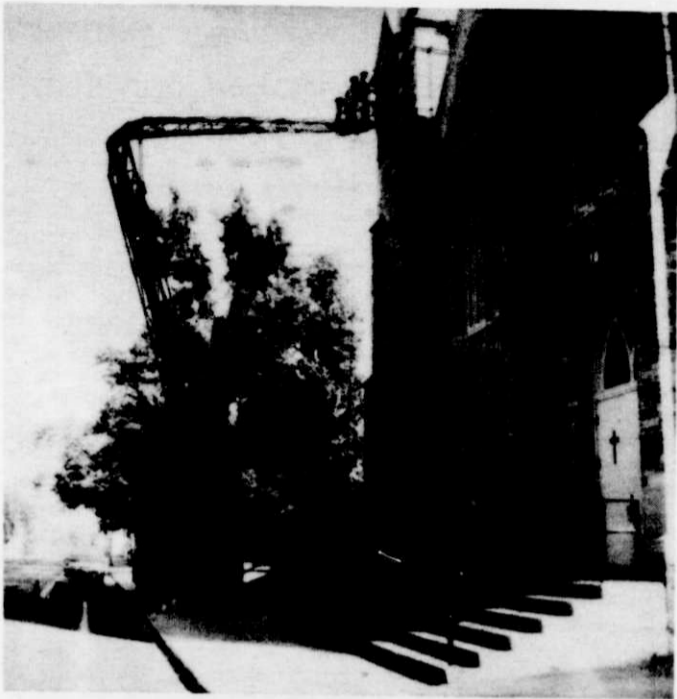

Kiwanis Turkey Shoot on Sunday

The Kiwanis Club of Kewaskum will sponsor its 24th Annual Turkey Shoot on Sunday, Sept. 12, at the Barn Dude Ranch, six miles northeast of Kewaskum on County Trunk GGG, the beautiful Kettle Moraine Drive.

This fascinating annual event has become an outstanding attraction. Thousands of men, women and children from all over the state attend as participants and spectators.

For a fee of \$1.50 for three shots (three shots for \$1.00 on advance sale tickets which may be ordered from Kiwanis Club of Kewaskum, Kewaskum, Wisconsin 53040), the marksman attempts to win a fine frozen turkey. There are

special lines for ladies and children. Rifles and ammunition are furnished.

Trout Fishing Contests are another attraction. The angler keeps the fish he catches. In addition, there is a grand prize for the person catching the largest fish.

Trap shooting contests are conducted throughout the day. Sportsmen desiring to enter these events may bring their own shotguns and ammunition. There is also an archery target range, as well as other marksmanship contests. In addition, there are games for every member of the family to enjoy. Shelter, brats, hamburgers and both hot and cold beverages will be available.

Award Contract For Excavation Of Park Pond

Washkovic Grading of Green Lake was officially awarded the contract for excavation of Kewaskum's new pond by the Kewaskum Village Board on Thursday.

The contract was in the amount of \$25,799.40, which is \$14,225 less than the original bid, since the plastic liner that was to cover the bottom of the pond will be deleted, at the recommendation of the Department of Health.

Equipment to do the excavation is presently located in Fond du Lac, and will be brought down within the next 14 to 21 days. According to the terms of the contract, the excavators will have 100 days to complete the job.

Talks are already being planned for each of the service organizations in town to keep them aware of how the work is proceeding, as well as public meetings for the benefit of the rest of the community.

About \$400,000 is planned for borrowing to finish the rest of the park, which can be obtained at about 5% interest. Valley Bank of Kewaskum and First Wisconsin of Milwaukee were contacted to determine the possible interest rates available. Sufficient money to pay for the pond is already available, but the rest will have to be raised through a referendum.

Funding at a level of between 10 and 65% should be available from the State of Wisconsin, but not for the pond.

Board of Education Faces Busy Agenda At Meeting Monday

The Kewaskum Board of Education will meet Monday, Sept. 13, at the school administrative offices. Included on the agenda will be a report on an aide for the Farmington kindergarten. If there is a recommendation the board will also take action on a contract to fill the pre-school special education program. Consideration will also be given to elimination of the half-time special services manager position, with the money being transferred to the secretarial salary account for added secretarial time. The position elimination, as recommended, would be effective at the end of September.

Also on the agenda will be consideration of a request by Mr. Carpenter to be released from his contract as English teacher at the high school.

Aaron Buslaff, 23 Months, Killed When Struck by Car in Waucousta

The death of a small child Friday afternoon in Waucousta pushed the 1976 traffic fatality toll in Fond du Lac County to 18 compared to 11 on the same date in 1975.

Fond du Lac County police said that Aaron Scott Buslaff, 23-months-old, the son of Mr. and Mrs. David Buslaff, Route 2, Campbellsport, was dead on arrival at St. Agnes Hospital, Fond du Lac, after he was struck by an auto at 5:05 p. m.

Anthony H. Thoma, Kewaskum told police that he was slowing his car down as he entered the village on Highway 45 when he saw two wo-

men walk across the highway. The next thing he knew there was a small child by the front fender of his car.

The mishap occurred near the intersection with County Trunk F.

Aaron is survived by his parents; paternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Walter Buslaff of Route 3, Campbellsport; maternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Earl Mueller of Route 6, Fond du Lac; paternal great-grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Oscar Damerow of Millbank, S.D.; and maternal great-grandparents, Mrs. Leona Viehstedt of Fond du Lac and Irvin Mueller of Route 6, Fond du Lac.

Funeral services for Aaron Scott Buslaff, the son of David and Patricia Mueller Buslaff, were held at 9:30 a. m. Monday at the Twohig Funeral Home, Campbellsport, and at 10 a. m. at St. Matthew's Church, Campbellsport. The Rev. Victor Kemmer officiated and burial was in the parish cemetery. Visitation was held after 6 p. m. Sunday at the funeral home.

Enrollment Up In High School, Down in Grades

During the first week of school in the Kewaskum District, total enrollment showed a slight decrease from last year but the opening of the new St. Lucas Parochial School in the village no doubt made the difference in the decrease.

As of the opening day Aug. 30, there were 2,123 students enrolled in the high school, middle school and four elementary schools in the district. That figure was down by 39 from last year but it must be taken into consideration that approximately 56 students transferred to the new St. Lucas Lutheran School this fall.

The 2,123 opening day figure may still go up or down with the next week or two, prior to the important third Friday in September which is used for state aid figures.

The breakdown shows that there are 765 students in the high school, 321 in the two-year middle school 474 in the Kewaskum Elementary School, 273 at Farmington, 103 at Beechwood and 183 at Wayne.

At the high school, an increase of 25 students was reported. Beechwood remained nearly the same, up two from 101 to 103. Wayne was about the same, but the other elementary schools had drops in enrollment.

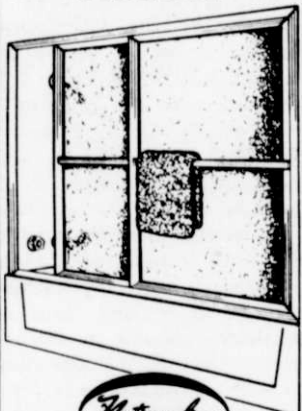

MINUTES OF VILLAGE BOARD MEETINGS

Adjourned Session
August 30, 1976
7:30 P. M.

The Village Board of Kewaskum, Washington County, Wisconsin met in adjourned session in the Council Room of the Municipal Building.

President Charles Miller presided and all Village Board Members were present.

The minutes of the meetings of August 16 and August 24 were approved as printed. Motion by Trustee Herriges, seconded by Trustee Danielsen. Unanimous vote.

The first order of business was the public hearing on the contemplated installation of curb and gutter improvements on the streets as designated in the public notice published in the official newspaper, The Kewaskum Statesman, on August 20 and August 27, 1976. Mrs. Hollister DeMotts appeared to question the grade elevation of the proposed curb on Moraine Court. Mrs. DeMotts was assured that the engineering Consultant would take into consideration the nature of the terrain on Moraine Court if and when the actual installation of the curb is commenced. There were no other objections to the installation of curbing as proposed and the hearing was declared closed by President Miller.

**RESOLUTION NO. 76-7
FINAL RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CURB AND GUTTER IMPROVEMENTS AND LEVYING SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS AGAINST BENEFITED PROPERTY.**

WHEREAS, the Village Board of the Village of Kewaskum, Wisconsin, held a public hearing at the Municipal Building at 7:30 p. m. on the 30th day of August 1976, for the purpose of hearing all interested persons concerning the preliminary resolution and report of the Village Engineer on the proposed improvement and construction of curb and gutter on both sides of the following streets or portions of streets:

A. All property fronting on Stark Street north of Keller Street.

B. All property fronting on Moraine Court.

C. All property fronting on the North side of Werner Drive.

D. All property fronting on Lin-De Lane west of Bel Ric Drive.

E. All property fronting on Brooklane Drive from Edgewood to Hillside.

F. All property fronting on Edgewood Road in Roseland Hills Addition No. 2, and has heard all persons desiring audience at such hearing:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Village Board of the Village of Kewaskum as follows:

1. That the report of the Village Engineer pertaining to the construction of the above-described public improvements, including plans and specifications therefore, is hereby adopted and approved.

2. That the action relative to and the advertisement for bids and to carry out the work of such improvement in accordance with the report of the Village Engineer is approved.

3. That payment for said improvements be made by assessing the cost to the property benefited as indicated in said report.

4. That benefits shown on the report are true and correct, have been determined on a reasonable basis and are hereby confirmed.

5. That the assessments for all projects included in said report are hereby combined as a single assessment.

6. That the assessments against any parcel may be paid in cash or in four (4) annual installments to the Village Commissioner, deferred payments to bear interest at the rate of 8% per annum on the unpaid balance. Installments or assessments not paid when due shall bear additional interest on the amount due at the rate of 1.6% per annum.

7. The Village Commissioner is directed to publish this resolution as a class 1 notice in the assessment district.

8. The Commissioner is further directed to mail a copy of this resolution and a statement of the final assessment against his property to every property owner whose name appears on the assessment roll whose post-office address is known or can with

reasonable diligence be ascertained.

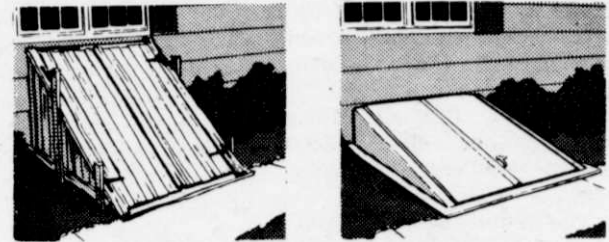

Potter has two years of teaching experience, according to Farmington Principal Tom Larsen. He will teach science in grades 4, 5 and 6 and also some reading.

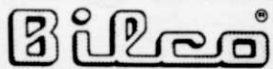

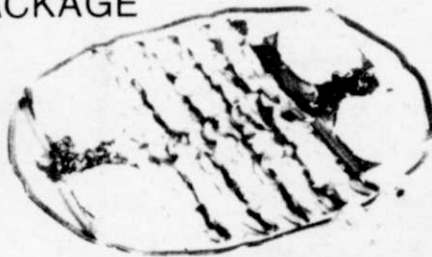

Notice is hereby given of a September Primary election to be held in the several wards in the County of Washington, on the 14th day of September, 1976, at which the officers named below shall be chosen. The names of the candidates for each office to be voted for, whose nominations have been certified to or filed in this office, are given under the title of the office and under the appropriate party or other designation, each in its proper column.

INFORMATION TO ELECTORS

Upon entering the polling place, an elector shall give his name and address before receiving the ballot from the ballot clerk. The initials of 2 ballot clerks must appear on the ballot. Upon receiving the ballot, the elector shall retire alone to a voting booth and mark his ballot. A ballot clerk may inform the elector of the proper manner for marking a ballot, but he shall not in any manner advise or indicate for whom to vote.

At a partisan primary, the elector shall select the party ballot of his choice and make a cross or other mark in the square at the right of the candidate's name for each office for whom he intends to vote or insert or write in the name of his choice for a candidate.

The ballot should not be marked in any other manner. If the elector spoils a ballot, he shall return it to an election official who shall issue another in its place, but not more than 3 ballots shall be issued to any one elector. Not more than 5 minutes' time shall be allowed to mark the ballot. Unofficial ballots or a memorandum to assist the elector in marking his ballot may be taken into the booth and copied. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal how the ballot is marked.

After the official ballot is marked, it shall be folded so the inside marks do not show but so the printed indorsements and ballot clerks' initials on the outside do show. After folding the ballot, the elector shall leave the booth, give his name to the inspector in charge of the ballot box, hand him the ballot to be placed in the ballot box, and leave the polling place promptly.

An elector may be assisted by 2 election officials of different political parties in marking the ballot if he declares to the presiding official that he is unable to read, that he has difficulty reading, writing or understanding English or that due to physical disability he is unable to mark his ballot. Alternatively, an elector making such declaration may have another elector of the county assist him in marking his ballot or operating a voting machine. The presiding official may administer an oath to a person making such declaration.

A qualified voter is one who is a U.S. citizen, will be 18 years of age or older on election day, and who has resided in the ward or aldermanic district where voting is desired to be accomplished for at least 10 days prior to the election. If the voter resides in a municipality which requires voter registration, then registration is also a requisite for the voter who is qualified in other respects.

To obtain an absentee ballot, contact the clerk in the city, village or town in which you reside by mail or telephone, or in person, and request an application form. If returning the ballots in person, the affidavit-certificate must be properly completed and subscribed and sworn to by the clerk or the deputy clerk who are authorized to administer oaths. In either case the marked, sealed ballot must be in the hands of the issuing municipal clerk on or before election day. Any absentee ballot received at the polling place after the polls close or received in incomplete or improper form cannot be counted.

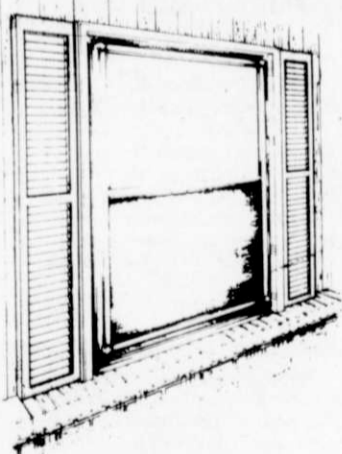

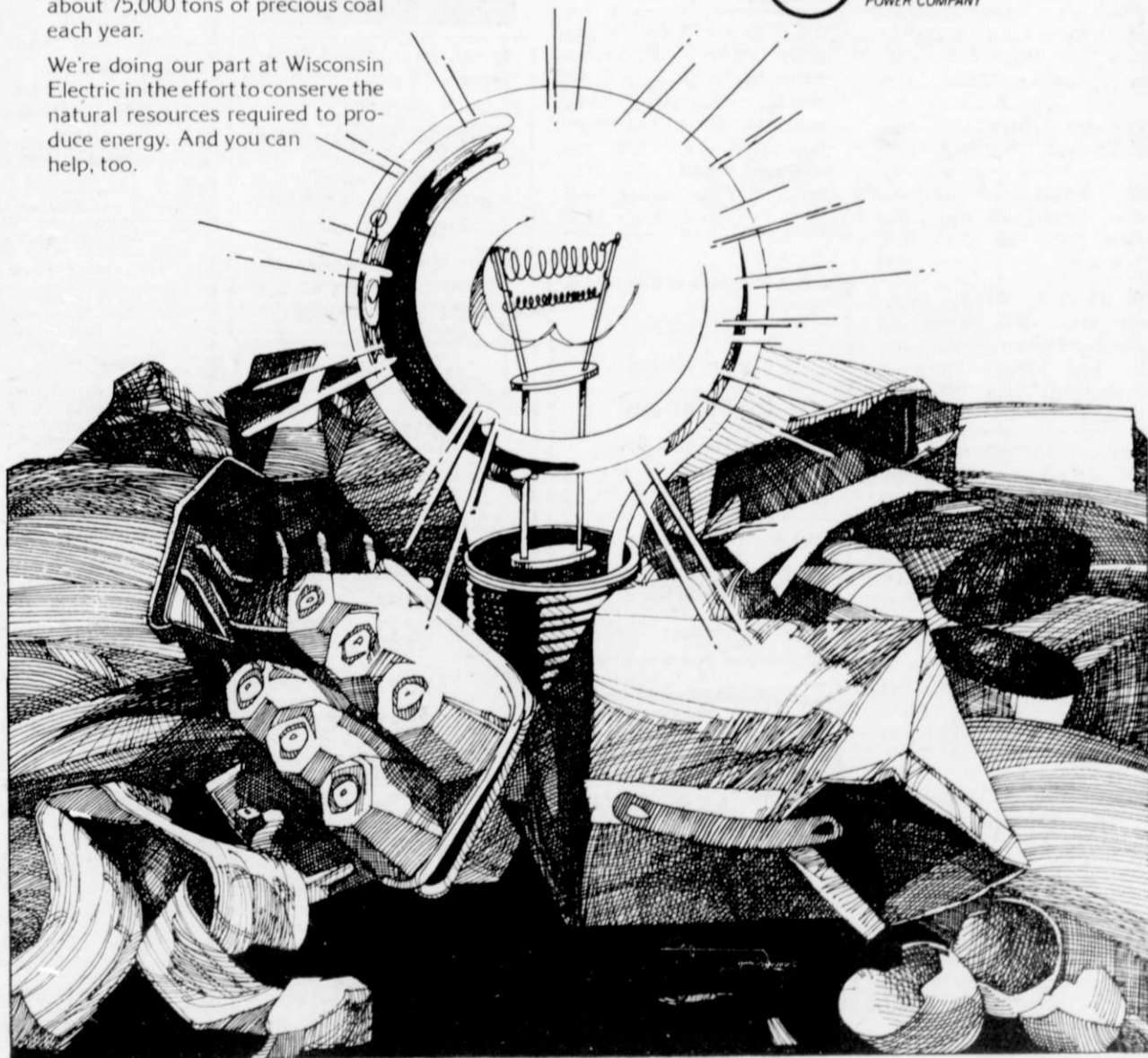

Indians Romp to 2nd Non-Loop Victory at Campbellsport, 26-6

With two long runs, two long drives and a stout defense again, which shut out North Fondy the week before, the Kewaskum Indians trounced rival Campbellsport on the Cougar's field Friday night, 26-6.

The long runs were a 32-yard scamper by quarterback Paul Brenholt and an 89-yard kickoff return by Randy White to start the second half. The long drives were of 95 and 96 yards, respectively. The defense held the Cougars to a total of 131 yards gained, just one-third of Kewaskum's 363. Kewaskum made 345 yards rushing to Campbellsport's 97, and had 18 first downs to their 11.

Brenholt's long run was on the first offensive play for Kewaskum. The Cougars had received the opening kickoff and on the second play from scrimmage the football was jarred loose from Cougar Joe Schmidt. Greg Eichstedt recovered on the 32-yard line and on the next play Brenholt streaked down the sidelines for the score.

Campbellsport was stopped twice in the first quarter and forced to punt. The second punt rolled to the Kewaskum five yard line and from here Kewaskum drove 95 yards for another TD. Brenholt added 2 points on a run to make it 14-0.

The Cougars were unable to generate much of an offensive in the first half, getting only one first down. Their only score came on an interception on the last play of the half by Schmidt, who went all the way down the sideline for the score, making it 14-6 at halftime.

Kewaskum was close to another score just before the interception with Brenholt's pass to White on the one yard line. But it was ruled by the officials that the pass was caught out of bounds. On the next play Brenholt attempted to pass again with 8 seconds remaining. The pass was underthrown and picked off by Schmidt who ran 80 yards.

Following the Cougar's score on the last play of the half, the Indians came right back with another TD on the second half kickoff with White's 89-yard kickoff return to make it 20-6.

Campbellsport fought back to drive close to the goal where they were held to a standstill. Kewaskum's stiff defense held for four plays. On the one-yard line the Cougars had 2 chances to score but Dennis Beck was thrown for a one-yard loss on the first try and quarterback Larry Pesch was sacked for a 3-yard loss on the last try.

Kewaskum took over and drove 96 yards for their final tally, using up much time in the final quarter. The drive was led by Eichstedt, Jim Donath and Wayne Endlich, and the TD made it 26-6.

Kewaskum actually scored another touchdown by Chuck

Dreher which was called back on a clipping call. This score and Brenholt's pass to White before the half that was ruled out of bounds on the one-yard line could have turned it into a rout.

Led by Brenholt with 78 yards in 10 carries and Eichstedt with 76 yards in 10 carries, five backs rushed for 52 or more yards for Kewaskum. Campbellsport was led by Dennis Beck with 53 yards in 12 carries.

Coach Joe Harlow praised defensive end Larry Morenzen, 200-pound defensive tackle and all-conference Gary Gavin, and linebackers Mike Perkins and Jim Donath.

This Friday night at 7:30 the Indians will take on a new opponent in their first home game when they host Milwaukee University School. Little is known about the strength of MUS, which will be the last non-conference foe.


