Full Agenda Faces Board of Education

A full agenda will face the Kewaskum Board of Education at the meeting on Monday, Sept. 12. The meeting will be held at the administration offices and will begin at 8 p. m.

The question of adding a business manager or an assistant superintendent will be on the agenda. This was previously voted down by the board, but action was taken at the annual meeting adding money to the budget, and it was stated that it was desired the money be added for this purpose. The action is not binding on the board.

A question on transporting to a parochial school in Mayville will be considered. Revision of the contract for Carol Martin, home economics teacher will be considered, as will affirmation of the contract with Margaret Smith. The latter is necessitated by the beginning of duties under the contract prior to official release from her previous position.

Approval of wages of final classified positions will be considered, as will a CESA Child Find project, cancelling the second September meeting and disposing of a van, no longer worth repairing. A request for a week leave will also be considered, and an enrollment report will be given. Gasoline bids will be opened, and the board will consider other items which may come up.

The board will meet in closed session following the regular meeting to discuss teacher negotiations.

Area Students MPTI Graduates

Eleven students have recently graduated from Moraine Park Technical Institute's one-year diploma Electronics Servicing program at Fond du Lac. The program provides the fundamental knowledge and practical know-how for employment in the maintenance and servicing of electronic systems; television, radio, recording, hi-fi and stereo sets, business machines, electrical appliances and similar devices.

Graduates from this area include: Scott Waranius, Box 111, Kewaskum.

Sixteen students have graduated recently from MPTI's one-year Cosmetology program at Fond du Lac. The program is designed to give the student theoretical instruction as well as practical clinical experience in a salon. Graduates complete a course of instruction of not less than 1,500 hours, meeting more than the minimal state required quotas of patron assignments during the clinical training period.

Graduates include Melodie J. Dorn, 7725 Kettle View Dr., Kewaskum.

Thirteen students have graduated from MPTI's one-year diploma Small Engine Chassis Mechanic program at Fond du Lac. Instruction in the program is directed toward the repair and maintenance of small internal combustion engines and the vehicles and equipment these engines power. Graduating students have skills in engine tune-up and repair as well as maintenance and repair of power trains, hydraulic systems, suspension systems and other power products components.

Patti Dreher New Dental Assistant

Eight members of the June, 1977, Dental Assistant program class of Lakeshore Technical Institute of Cleveland, Wis., have passed the certification examination administered by the American Dental Assistants Association.

The examination was developed to measure the knowledge and skill used by the dental assistant in the dental office and included parts on science, procedures and radiology. The LTI graduates scored above the national average in each part of the examination.

Enrollment Up by One in School District

Kewaskum School Superintendent Floyd Brenholt reported a total enrollment figure for the district in the first week of school of 2,127 as compared with a figure of 2,126 a year ago, an increase of one. He said children are still moving in and out of the district, however.

There were slight increases in both the Kewaskum Middle School and High School. These totals are 338 in the middle school and 778 in high school.

A breakdown shows 1,011 children in the elementary schools.

The Beechwood School has 93 pupils this year as compared to 103 last year. But this year the kindergarten students from that school are being bused to Farmington, accounting for the drop in enrollment.

Farmington School is up four students from 275 to 279, including the additional pupils from Beechwood.

Wayne Elementary has gone down 10 students from 180 to 170, but there is a large kindergarten class of 30 in that school.

In Kewaskum there are a total of 469 as compared with 477 last year.

The official total, for state aid purposes, will be taken on the third Friday in September.

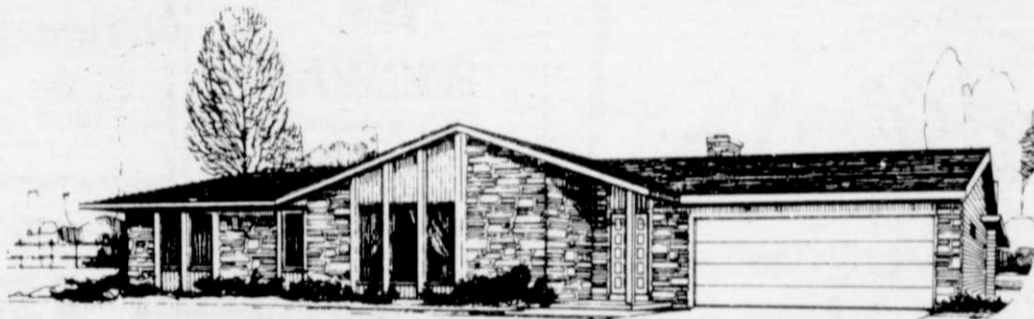

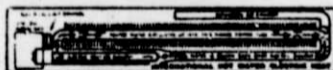

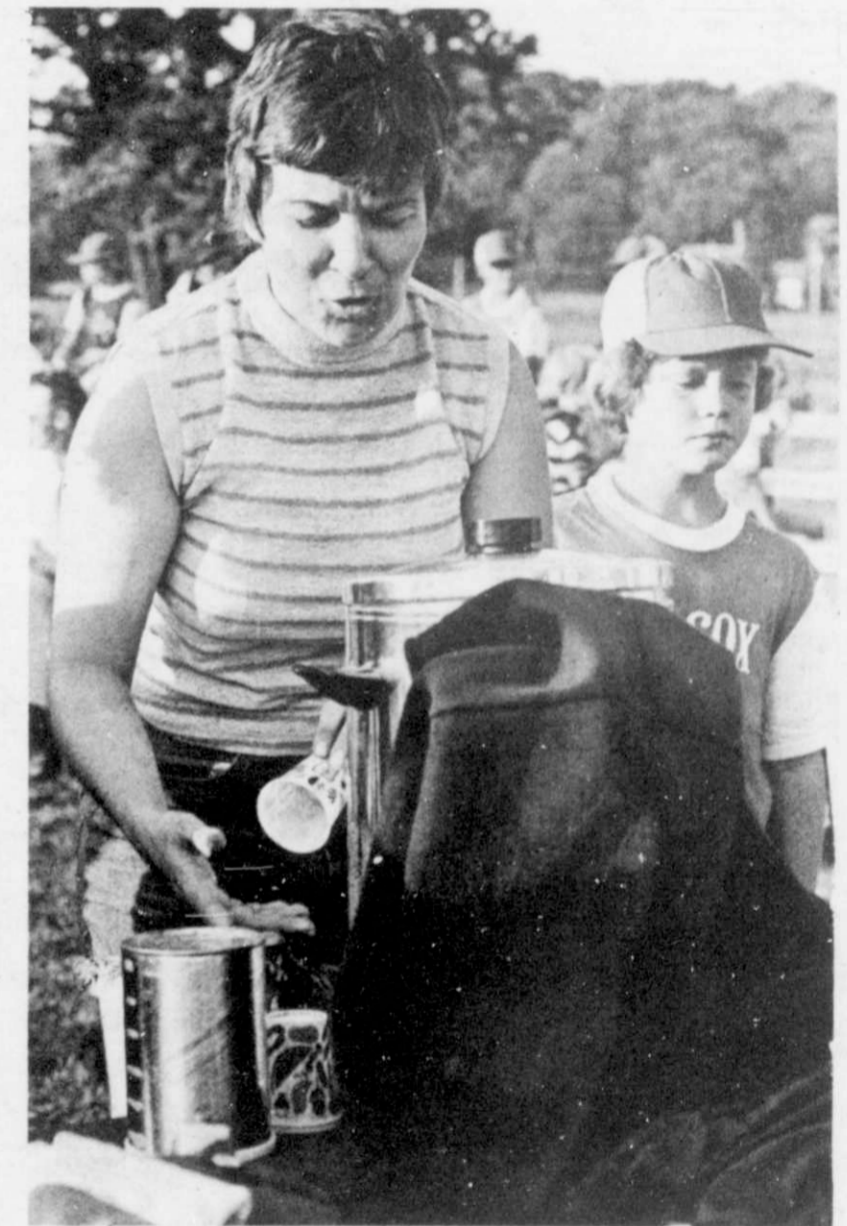

Citizen, will be 18 years of age or older on election day, and who has resided in the ward or aldermanic district where voting is desired to be accomplished for at least 10 days prior to the election. If the voter resides in a municipality which requires voter registration, then registration is also a requisite for the voter who is qualified in other respects.

To obtain an absentee ballot, contact the clerk in the city, village or town in which you reside by mail or telephone, or in person, and request an application form. After properly completing and returning the application to the municipal clerk, an absentee ballot will be sent to you along with a postage pre-paid return envelope or given to you if the application is submitted to the clerk in person. The deadline for receipt of the application by the municipal clerk is 5:00 P. M. on the day before the election.

Absentee ballots can be marked at home anytime after they arrive in the mail. They can also be marked right in the clerk's office if submitting the application in person. If returning the ballots by mail, the affidavit certificate must be properly completed and witnessed by two persons. If returning the ballots in person, the affidavit certificate must be properly completed and subscribed and sworn to by the clerk or the deputy clerk who are authorized to administer oaths. In either case the marked, sealed ballot must be in the hands of the issuing municipal clerk on or before election day. Any absentee ballot received at the polling place after the polls close or received in incomplete or improper form cannot be counted.

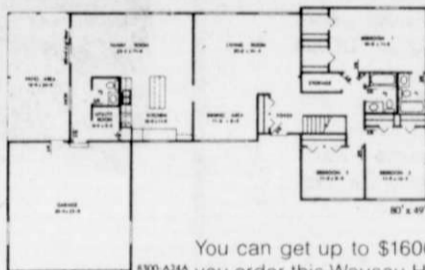
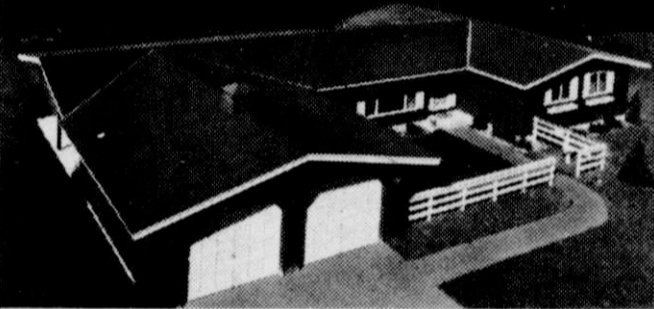

Neither team generated much offense in the third quarter, in which there were 4 punts. Near the end of the period, however, Kewaskum

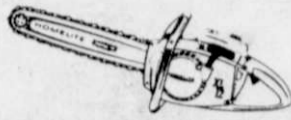

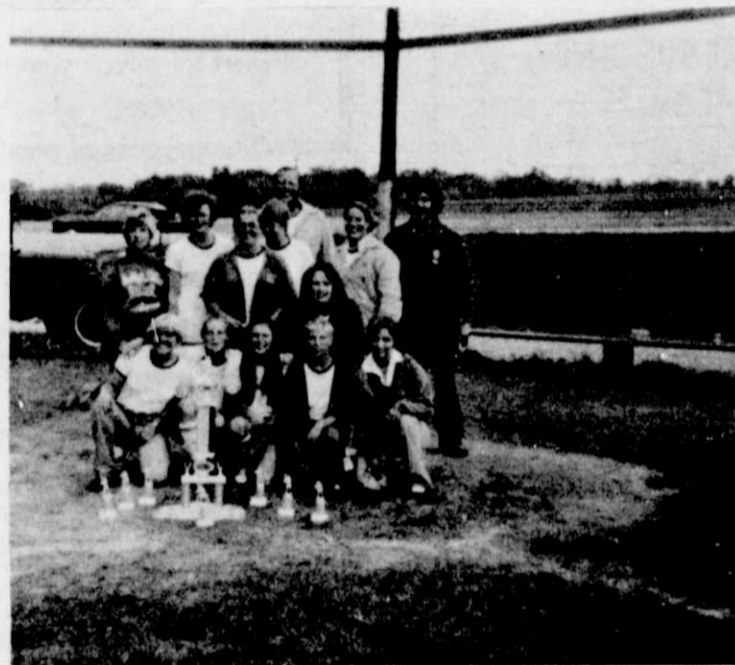
