A 15-year-old girl from the Campbellsport area was referred to juvenile authorities after she was involved in an accident with an allegedly stolen car on Monday afternoon of last week.

The car, which belonged to Lester Francke of Parkview Drive, Kewaskum, had been reported stolen from a spot on Kewaskum's Main Street about 2:30 p. m.

The accident occurred about 3 p. m. at the sharp turn on Silverbrook Drive north of Washington Street in West Bend. A West Bend police officer had been pursuing the car for several blocks, and the girl was reportedly going 50 to 60 miles per hour when she went off the curve. The car traveled about 100 feet farther and hit a pole, causing extensive damage.

The girl was taken to St. Joseph's Community Hospital by rescue squad for treatment of arm and shoulder injuries.

## MPTI Expansion Defeated; Only 129 Votes Here

Voters involving a ten-county area cast a decisive 3 to 1 "no" vote on the Moraine Park Technical Institute's \$4.5 million expansion referendum Tuesday.

Only about 13 per cent of the MPTI District's 135,000 eligible voters turned up at the polls. The result showed 13,384 against borrowing for expansions at Fond du Lac and West Bend campuses, and 4,267 voted "yes."

In the Village of Kewaskum only 129 voters, or about 10 percent of them, showed up at the polls. The result was 54 "yes" votes and 75 "no" votes.

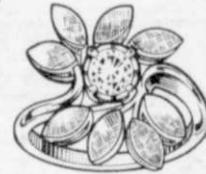

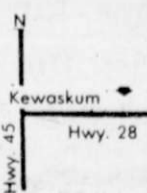

## Indians Lose Another Game by One Touchdown at Hartland, 15-8

The Kewaskum Indians, who have lost several games by one touchdown this year, had it happen again at Hartland Friday when they were defeated, 15-8, by the defending champion Warhawks, who made it to the playoffs last season.

Kewaskum scored first by recovering a Hartland fumble and driving 91 yards on 12 running plays. The drive was the Indians' best of the year. But the drive wasn't enough as the rest was all Hartland in their homecoming victory.

In the early going the Warhawks fumbled on their own nine yard line and Kewaskum's Nick Vogt came up with the ball. With Greg Pettit, Al Jaeger and Mike Eichstaedt carrying the ball, the Indians penetrated deep into Arrowhead territory before Eichstaedt scored from the one with 1:19 left in the first quarter.

Two of the big plays in the drive were by quarterback Jaeger, who picked up 20 yards on one and 27 on another when the Indians had a third down and seven to go. Jaeger also picked up the extra points on a run and Kewaskum was ahead 8-0.

Hartland put on a drive in the second quarter but the KHS defense stiffened at the 12-yard line. On a field goal try, Lon Bahr made good from 28 yards out to cut the margin to 8-3.

The Indians put on another drive from their own eight to Hartland's 36 but time ran out in the half.

In the second half Hartland went ahead with 6:46 left in the third quarter on a one-yard plunge by Lance Roberts. The extra point attempt was blocked by John Bemis and it was 9-8, Warhawks. Their drive covered 75 yards,

20 of them on penalties.

The Indians got inside Hartland's 35 again but an intercepted pass by Chris Venden-Heuvel ended that drive. Arrowhead then got an insurance TD with only 1:45 remaining, which was set up by a 45-yard run by Roberts.

Kewaskum tried to get back into the game with some passes but another interception at the 28-yard line again ended the threat.

Top ground gainers for the Indians were Mike Schaub with 84 yards and Jaeger with 81. Eichstaedt and Rich Boden played well defensively.

In one other contest Friday Mayville rolled over Pewaukee, 28-6, and in Saturday games unbeaten Grafton, rated second in the state, trounced Slinger, 34-6, and Germantown beat Kettle Moraine, 36-12.

In a home game Wednesday night, the Indians brought their season to a close against Pewaukee, whose quarterback Peter Opie suffered a broken collarbone in the Mayville tilt last week.

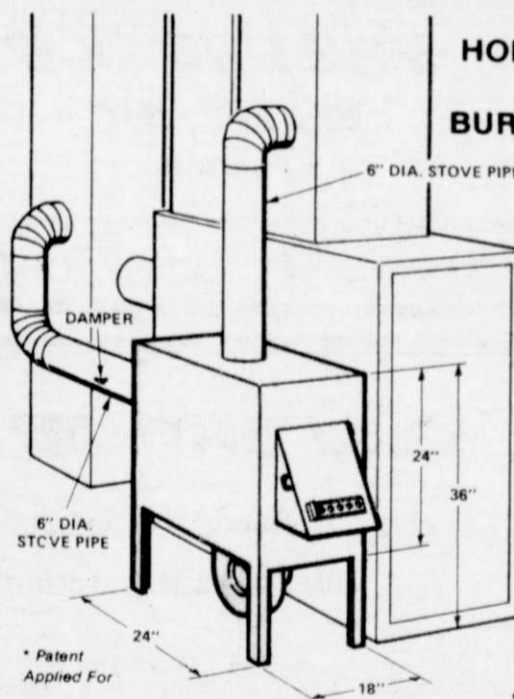
