## Board Accepts Bid to Rejuvenate Water Tower, Acts on Other Business

Kewaskum trustees voted Monday night to rejuvenate the water tower and stand pipe this coming summer.

A bid of \$18,600, not including any additional welding, was accepted from the Lane Tank Company of Menomonie. Pete Albers gave a firsthand account of Lane's work in Allenton by commenting on the sandblasting done. Sandblasting "the entire inside of the tank, and over 90 per cent of the outside" was done to remove peeling layers of old paint. Special tank paint is used inside, and after a primer, the outside is painted with aluminum paint. The need for welding was not anticipated

as being very great by Augie Bilgo.

Equipment for spreading sand and salt will not be discussed until "a few more returns" come in to Bilgo. He sent out five requests for bids.

Pro-Built Homes, Inc. was granted a request to build a one-family dwelling on Knights Avenue. There had been notations by Henry Becker, Building Inspector, concerning a lack of a fireproof wall and a fire door in the garage.

The Village Store was granted a request to install a curbside hitching post. President Charles Miller quipped that the village must have "just finished" removing the last of them.

The extra closed session of

the Village Board last week culminated in the unanimous approval of the job study and wage adjustment proposal to be effective the first pay period in December. Details will be released to the public after they have been discussed with the individual employees involved.

Although Kewaskum officials cannot be certain "when and how much" reimburse-

ment will come from federal sources, at least the EPA made its final inspection, and, according to Charles Miller, the Inspector "was pleased with the way things were." Hope was expressed that some tangible result could be seen "within the next year."

Miller said he had already been in touch with a firm "interested in tertiary treatment" of Kewaskum's wastewater. Towns with populations under 10,000 seem to be their specialty.

A variance was granted to Kewaskum by the DNR. Removal of 85 per cent of solid waste from wastewater entering the Milwaukee River will be acceptable. The granting of such a permit is on a year-to-year basis and meets DNR standards.

James Arthur submitted his final estimates, but there was not enough prior notice to call a meeting of the Park Committee before Monday. Dan Schmidt reported that he had been informed that funding could be reimbursed without submitting bids, a new policy this year, if material requirements would be explicit in DNR funding requests.

To date, excavators have moved off the job with all but the infield of the baseball diamond completed. Rough grading is done, and as soon as freezing weather permits the ground to harden, gravel can be laid for the courts, parking lot and the path.

Although there was no discussion on the sidewalk proposal, Bel-Ric subdivision representatives submitted a petition signed by 55 people opposed to the installation of new sidewalks. Also represented were 26 other families against and five people in favor of new sidewalks. A copy of ten reasons in support of their views was attached to the petition. Included were reasons of maintenance costs, "poor planning" of grades in Bel-Ric, a chance of the schools' discontinuing bussing and the idea that "the voice of the people" should be heard in making a decision of this kind.

We, the WEST BEND (Wis.) CITIZENS FOR DECENCY THROUGH LAW, INC. are being taken to court because we asked the voters to vote YES on the question of prohibiting pornography in West Bend.

After our West Bend officials ignored a petition to enforce the Wisconsin obscenity laws against a local adult book store, we asked the voters in an opinion poll at the last city election: "SHALL THE CITY OF WEST BEND PROHIBIT THE SALE AND EXHIBITION OF EXPLICIT, HARD CORE PORNOGRAPHIC MATERIAL WITHIN THE CITY?"

77% of them voted YES. IT SHOULD BE PROHIBITED; but because we did that we are accused of political activity and violation of the WISCONSIN CAMPAIGN FI-

**NANCING LAW.**

We believe this is an injustice because:

1. Pornography is not a political, but a moral issue.
2. We did not influence voters on a political issue, and did not try to elect or defeat any political candidate.
3. Explicit, hard-core pornography already was illegal and we only sought enforcement of the law one way or another.

4. It simply is not right to sue well-meaning citizens for asking their elected officials to protect their families and community from obscenity that already is illegal.

5. Prosecution of our organization has a chilling effect on other citizens with the courage to stand up and fight for law and order.

We don't believe that the Wisconsin Campaign Financing Law intended it to be enforced against activities such as ours. If it is true that we violated the law, as it is written, then we believe the law needs to be changed. We insist on a jury trial, even though we are mindful of the high cost, because our STRONG MORAL CONVICTIONS TELL US THAT THIS

**IS AN INJUSTICE.**

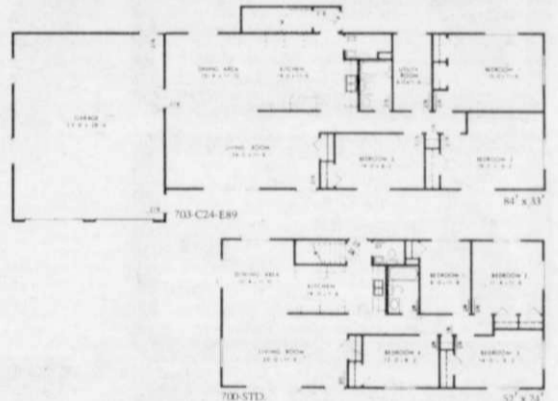
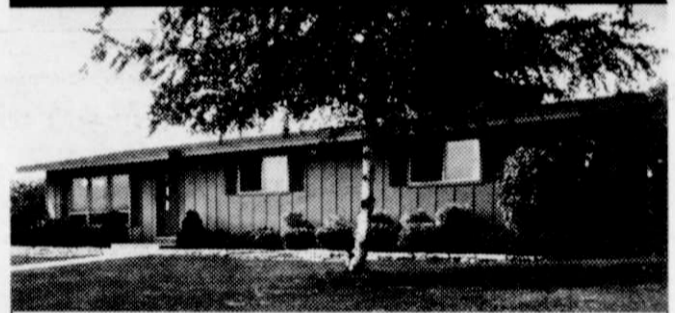

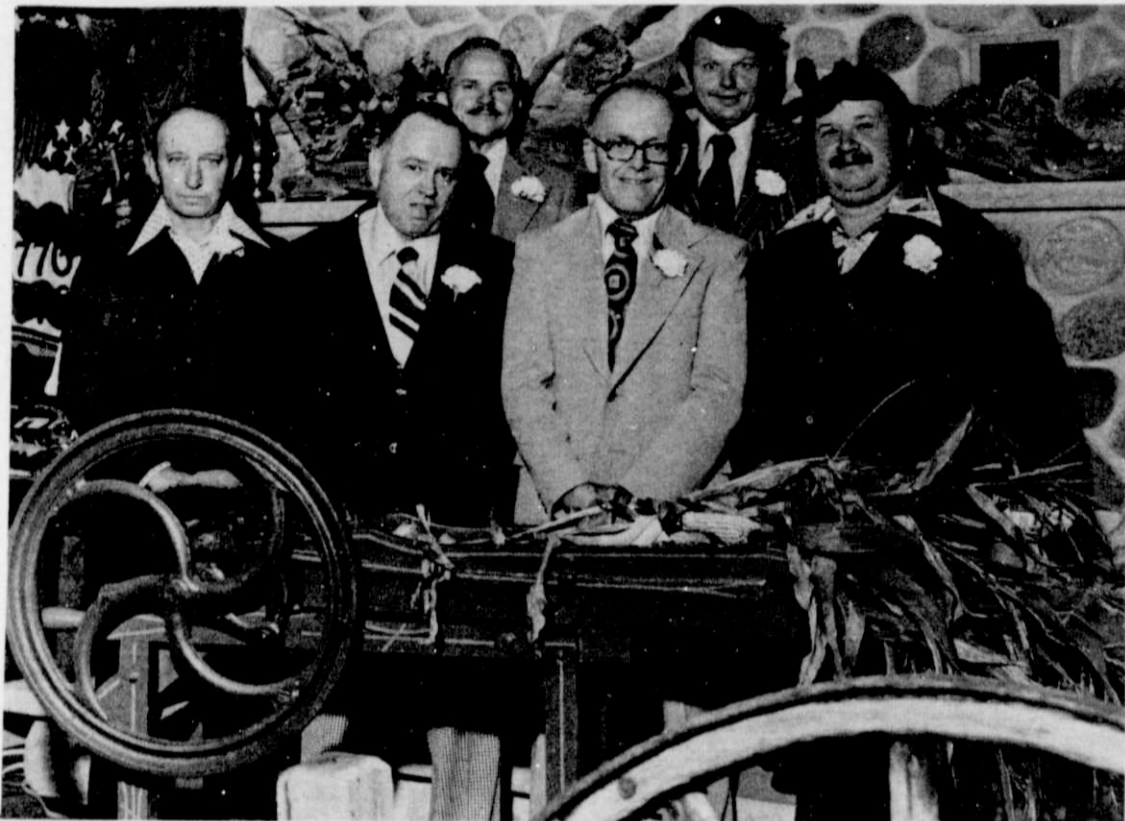
