## Budget Hearing

### Final Assessment Figures Still Unavailable for Village Board

With only a little more than two weeks left in the year, final assessment figures were still unavailable for the Village Board to work with at the Budget Hearing Tuesday evening.

Only a few bookkeeping adjustments were necessary, with the proposed budget for 1978 standing at \$1,443,231.40. Some changes may be made — to the advantage of village funds — if M & E reimbursements exceed the projected \$8,200. Commissioner William Martin said that figure "cannot be any less" at any rate. President Charles Miller commented that if more money did become available, the debt "could add to the village retirement."

Daniel Schmidt asked if new wage schedules had been computed into the budget figures. Some changes could

be necessary in that area, as well.

The only other affirmative action taken by the board Tuesday evening will mean "smooth sailing" — or perhaps a little less of that for village residents traveling winter roads. A total of \$3,160 will purchase a nine-foot, hopper type salt and sand spreader complete with the installation of a hydraulic pump to operate it.

Discussion of a street sweeper and proposals for the purchase of tires for village equipment ended with tablings.

State 144 south of State 33 was also closed due to blowing and drifting snow. Most town roads were impassable. The Washington County Highway Department had all available trucks out Friday morning but plowing conditions were difficult with visibility near zero.

### School Board's Cost for Special Services from WASB Increased

The cost for special services purchased from the Wisconsin Association of School Boards will be higher this year. The School Board voted to accept a contract with the WASB for special services computed at a \$5 per hour increase over last year's fee of \$30 per hour when performed "within the school district" and \$5 per hour more than last year's fee of \$25 for services "performed in the association office." The minimum contract costs \$500.

Basically, the district's main use of WASB services has been through their representative at bargaining sessions with the teacher's union. The board may also ask for assistance in "writing job descriptions" and other areas of personnel and salary evaluations as well.

Supt. Floyd Brenholt reported that after an audit by the state Kewaskum would probably "be off only one to three students" in the official count taken the third Friday of September each year. Richard Theusch wished to commend Brenholt for his handling of the enrollment computations affecting the amount of state funds received by the district. Brenholt said he would "pass along" the compliment to the principals of each school.

The school's twelve-horse-power John Deere tractor will be fitted with new snow blowing equipment as soon as Brenholt determines the lowest bid of the three possible in this area. The board voted to purchase the snow blower on that basis.

Although all information has not yet been "fed" to the computer programming service leased by the district this year, the first month's "print-out" was available for board inspection. Based on a fourteen-digit code, budget allocations are recorded and itemized for monthly inspection.

Clerk James Oelhafen announced that the time period

### Town Kewaskum Tax Rate \$22.73

Tax bills for Town of Kewaskum residents will be mailed out before Christmas this year. The rate has increased slightly.

State tax rate will be approximately 26 cents ('76 24c), county tax is \$4.24 ('76 \$4.25), town tax \$1.62 ('76 \$1.00). Kewaskum schools \$16.40 ('76 \$15.79) and vocational schools \$1.76 ('76 \$1.68); total \$24.28 ('76 \$23.00).

Handicapped tuition is included in the Kewaskum schools levy this year. Assessed value of the township is \$15,197,545.

Tax credit for line A personal property (cattle, stocks, etc.) will be \$19.42 per thousand. Real property and line B personal property tax credit will be \$1.55, setting the net tax rate at \$22.73 per thousand dollars of assessment.

The tax roll is being prepared by computer at the Southeastern Regional Planning Commission, Waukesha, and final rates may vary a penny or two.

## WEEKLY Health TIP

Many middle aged and elderly persons suffer from softening of the bones called osteoporosis, due to a gradual loss of calcium in the bones. They become brittle, deformed, and easily fractured. Bones contain 99% of the body's calcium. Studies over several years show that nearly all osteoporosis patients had a low calcium level in their diet, and that by drinking more milk, the calcium level in the body improved. To prevent bone softening, a daily intake of at least one gram of calcium (3 glasses of milk) plus adequate protein, vitamins D and C, is recommended.

## Christmas Concert at High School

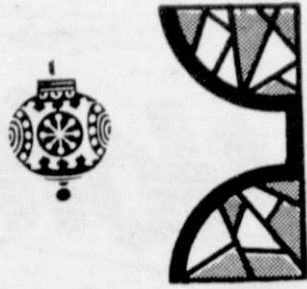
