## Kewaskum Tax Rate Finally Set at \$18.28 Per Thousand

The Village of Kewaskum finally received its assessment from the state this week and the board was able to set a tax rate at its meeting Tuesday night.

The figures came in higher than expected, leading to a final net rate of \$18.28 per thousand of assessed valuation. The total assessment of the village came close to \$46 million dollars.

The taxes and rates are as follows:

State taxes—\$8,553 at a rate of .19 per thousand.

County taxes—\$138,474 at a rate of \$3.03 per thousand.

School taxes—\$535,549 at a rate of \$11.73 per thousand.

Vocational School taxes—\$57,593 at a rate of \$1.26 per thousand.

Village taxes—\$318,452 at a rate of \$6.98 per thousand.

The total tax levy equaled \$1,058,600 with a gross tax rate of \$23.19.

The tax credit of \$4.91 per thousand subtracted from the gross rate results in the \$18.28 figure.

Village Commissioner William Martin explained the fi-

gures to the board and noted the \$18 figure would be the tax rate if there were no changes in the budget. He also explained that this year the village's actual levy is \$318,000, well under the \$405,000 set as the village's allowable spending limit. The budget had no changes.

The \$18.28 tax rate is much lower than last year's \$42.87. But the village has just gone through a total reassessment so it was estimated the rate would be half of the 1976 figure since the assessed valuation more than doubled.

The reason the Machinery and Equipment assessment from the state came in so late was due to the reassessment.

Martin said he was going to take all the figures to Waukesha Wednesday to have the tax roles computerized and he hopes to have them in the mail by Friday.

## Professor Probably Trimmed First Tree

No one is sure when the first Christmas tree appeared in America. Many believe the credit belongs to Charles Follen, a German professor who taught at Harvard. In 1832, he trimmed a tree for his small son. The following year, other Bostonians followed suit.

Later, trees became more

popular when Prince Albert, German-born consort of Queen Victoria popularized the Christmas tree in England by setting one up in Windsor Castle. Many Americans, eager to copy their sophisticated British cousins, trimmed a tree of their own.

The big boost came as late as 1845 when the best-selling "Kris Kringle's Christmas Tree" showed Americans how a Christmas tree should properly be decorated.

Volunteers make a four month commitment and work only eight hours per month on two shifts of their choosing. Most often, the shifts run from 6:00 p. m. to 10:00 p. m. Monday through Friday. In addition, a monthly in-service meeting is required.

Specifically, the program offers drug education, personal growth workshops, crisis intervention training and suicide prevention techniques. Volunteers will also have an opportunity to learn more about community services and to exchange thoughts and ideas with other individuals who are likely to have common concerns about current social issues.

The Open Door has found that some persons volunteer in order to gain worthwhile experience that can enhance a personal resume or aid college studies. Others volunteer because they have heard that the experience is both unique and challenging. And still others volunteer because they simply want to help people.

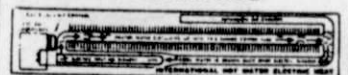

## MINUTES OF VILLAGE BOARD MEETING

Regular Meeting  
December 5, 1977  
8:00 P. M.

The Village Board of the Village of Kewaskum, Washington County Wisconsin, met in regular monthly session in the Council Room of the Municipal Building.

President Charles Miller presided. Present were Trustees G. Nigh, Danielsen, Schmidt, Kral and D. Nigh. Trustee Hergiges arrived at 9:15 p. m.

One correction was noted to the minutes of the meeting of November 21. The application for funding for the second phase of the development of the Kewaskum Kiwanis Community Park has not yet been submitted to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. The application is in the process of being prepared. In all other respects the minutes of the November 21 meeting were approved as printed. Motion by Trustee Danielsen, seconded by Trustee G. Nigh, Unanimous vote.

Trustee Danielsen, a member of the Administrative Committee, presented a report on the possible adjustment of the village's license and permit fees. Trustee Danielsen moved that the report be tabled to the next meeting so that all Board members would have time to study the report. The motion was seconded by Trustee Kral. Unanimous vote.

Trustee Daniel Schmidt and Trustee David Nigh expressed their views in support of the sidewalk installation program proposed by their committee. Approximately ten interested citizens were present at the meeting in opposition to the proposed program. Trustee Schmidt moved that the proposed sidewalk program be submitted to an "advisory vote at the Spring Election. Since there was opposition to the wording "advisory vote," Trustee Schmidt changed his motion to "referendum vote" at the Spring Election. Trustee Kral seconded the motion. Roll call vote was unanimous.

Wastewater Superintendent Peter Albers reported that vandalism had again occurred to the interior of the building at the main sewage lift station.

## WHERE IN THE WORLD?

Lantana, Florida Has World's Tallest Christmas Tree



The world's tallest Christmas tree, a majestic 102 foot Douglas Fir from Columbia County, Oregon, is to be on display commencing Monday December 5th at NATIONAL ENQUIRER headquarters in Lantana, Florida. It is the focal point of an internationally famed dramatic holiday presentation which has brought millions of visitors to the 7 1/2 acre publication headquarters for the past five years.

Towering more than ten stories above the landscaped gardens of The ENQUIRER, the tree will be decorated with 14,000 lights, 2,500 feet of garlands, 1,000 colored balls, 200 red bows, 200 3-foot candy canes, 100 snow flakes and a 6-foot silver star at its top. More than three quarters of a million Floridians and tourists are expected to view the spectacle from December 5th through Monday, January 2nd. The tree is lit from sundown to midnight every day of the week. Additionally, 30,000 twinkling lights and the world's newest and most unique model railroad panorama are to delight visitors in a fantasy land of color and drama.

Celebrities and public officials are expected to join at the official lighting of the tree on Monday night December 5th. Given to the people of Florida as a goodwill gesture from the people

of Oregon, the tree is a donation from the International Paper Company of that state. Its dimensions are awe-inspiring enough to be worthy of listing in the current Guinness Book of Records. Fifty-six years old, the giant fir weighs more than 8,000 pounds and boasts a spread of bottom branches reaching 130 feet in circumference at its base.

Even the circumstances concerning the tree's 3,600 mile journey from Oregon to Florida are historic. It is enclosed in a huge wooden box, donated by Crown Zellerbach Company to protect it from the elements. It was sprayed with a preservative and wrapped in polyethylene before being carefully crated. Special heaters installed in the box protected the tree from subzero temperatures encountered in the Rocky Mountains. Since no flat-car exists which can carry the giant, special linking of two cars was necessary in order to properly transport the tree through three changes of railroad systems.

As the tallest Christmas tree in the world, The NATIONAL ENQUIRER Douglas Fir dwarfs New York City's famed 60 footer that illuminates Rockefeller Center.

Santa Claus is planning on making his headquarters in Lantana, Florida, during the 1977 holiday season!

# THE LEGEND OF SAINT NICLOLAS



The legend of Saint Nicholas is, of course, centuries old, and began in Europe. The story had its beginning in the semi-tropical city of Patara, Turkey, where St. Nicholas was born and where he lived and died. Until after his death, when his remains were taken by Italian sailors to Bari, Italy, St. Nicholas traveled little, never venturing more than a few miles from his native region.

It was the goodness and generosity of St. Nicholas which led him to become the patron saint of many countries, of all boys, and of sailors.

Many legends concerning St. Nicholas, with re-telling have become a bit vague and clouded, but some things are certain: he was a man of wealth; he was generous and kind; and he was at one time Bishop of Myra.

### Three Dowries

What is generally believed to be St. Nicholas first and best-known act of kindness was the presentation of dowries to the three daughters of a poor nobleman. According to the story, St. Nicholas learned that the poor girls had decided among themselves that one of them would sell herself into slavery in order that the two others could marry in honor. On separate occasions, St. Nicholas tossed three bags of gold into each girl's window, so that all three were married with honor, and in the usual fashion, lived happily ever after.

St. Nicholas died in 342, after being imprisoned by the Roman Emperor Diocletian and released by the first Christian emperor, Constantine.

### FIREPLACE GIFT MAKES HOLIDAYS WARMER, SAFER



A gift for the house is a Christmas tradition in many homes. With the fireplace being used often these days for auxiliary heat and fuel conservation, accessories for the fireplace are more welcome than ever, according to the Fireplace Institute.

Many are useful as well as decorative. The popular fire-screens with tempered glass doors are energy savers. For safety's sake, a fireplace damper should not be closed for several hours after a fire dies out. The glass doors of the screen can be closed while the damper is left open and warm air is not drawn up the chimney.

This and other types of firescreens provide protection from sparks and hot coals popping out into the room. Some firescreens are free-standing, others attach to the fireplace opening. Custom-made screens are available for the odd-size fireplace.

To safely shift logs or place new ones in the hot fire chamber, a sturdy pair of tongs and a poker are needed. A brush and shovel for cleaning the fire chamber and hearth are often included in sets of tools designed to match your room decor. A woodholder or basket keep logs handy and neatly stacked by the hearth.

A grate and andirons hold logs correctly and provide air circulation for a good fire. In addition to conventional grates, many fireplace dealers offer grates constructed to direct more

of the heated air into the room.

Increased use of fireplaces for heat has made log lighters a popular accessory item. Gas lighters provide a steady flame until logs ignite. A tray that contains fuel and which slides under the logs can also be used as a substitute for kindling. The traditional Cape Cod fire lighter, a pot which holds fuel and a wand, is also popular both for decoration and lighting the fire. Commercially made fire-starting cubes are a safe substitute for kindling. Super long fireplace matches come in decorative containers.

For dedicated recyclers, manufactured logs are available in many fireplace accessory shops as well as a handy gadget that rolls old newspapers into tight "logs."

Old-fashioned bellows beside the hearth add a traditional decorative touch, but are also handy when the blaze needs some encouragement.

People are re-discovering the fascination of hearthside cooking. Long-handled popcorn poppers are fast moving items, say fireplace dealers. Grills for sizzling steaks and cast-iron pots for simmering beans or stew also are much in demand.

Since the energy crisis began, fireplaces aren't just for hanging Christmas stockings. It's the place where the family gathers for warmth, carols and good home cooking.

## SANTA IN THE UNITED STATES

Three men are generally credited with popularizing the image of Santa Clause as we know him in the United States.

In 1809 Washington Irving's "Knickerbocker History of New York" contained 25 references to the great gift giver, picturing him in a "low-brimmed hat" and Flemish trunk hose, smoking a pipe as he rode over rooftops dropping gifts down the chimney.

Clement Clark Moore took Santa from the horse-drawn wagon in 1823 and put him in a sleigh, exchanging the horses for eight tiny reindeer and portraying Santa as a jolly old gent, with a "little round belly", "dimples how merry" and a nose "like a cherry."

Thomas Nast, the great political cartoonist, made the final changes about 1863. He kept the pipe, beard and furs—but greatly enlarged Santa's "little round belly", making it the BIG round belly with which he is pictured today.

### WAX ON CARPET

If candle wax falls on your new carpet, don't despair. Remove as much as you can with your fingers. Sponge the spot with carbon tetrachloride and clean cloths, changing the cloths often. If the carpet has pile, brush the pile gently with a wire suede brush. When using carbon tetrachloride, avoid breathing the fumes. Be sure the area where you work is well ventilated.

### MUM'S THE WORD

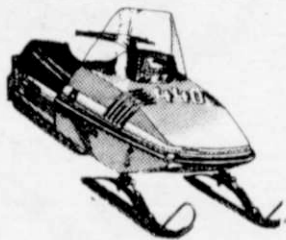

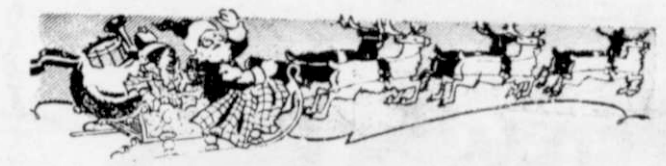

Christmas tree lights, while beautiful, can be dangerous if used carelessly.

Never allow children to play with lights. Be sure that all sockets contain a bulb. Check light strings before you use them. Discard or repair broken sockets or worn insulation. Never put lights on metal foil trees.

Check often to be sure bulbs do not touch branches, needles or flammable decorations.

Falling needles indicate the tree is drying out and could become a fire hazard.

The Christmas Crib is traced back to the little village of Greccio, Italy. There, in the village church, St. Francis of Assisi constructed a crude presentation of the stable scene at Bethlehem, using live animals and real people. Every year many of us receive a number of "unordered" items through the mails shortly before Christmas—such things as Christmas cards, pen and pencil sets, holiday envelope stickers, key rings, gift ties, etc. Later, a bill or a plea for a "Donation" follows with the message the money will be given over to a worthy cause.

Some of these solicitations are for worthy causes. Others are from someone trying to make a fast buck. What can you do about it?

Don't give unless you know where your money is going. If it is a legitimate cause, your Chamber of Commerce or Better Business Bureau will be able to tell you. If it is a worthy cause and you wish to participate, pay by check and keep the cancelled check.

If you doubt the cause is legitimate, or just don't wish to participate, mark the item "refused" and return it to the Post Office. Even if you opened it before you realized what was inside, you can rewrap it in the original wrapping as best you can, write "refused" and return it to the Post Office.

Whether you open the package or not, you don't have to pay for it. You are under no obligation to return it as "refused"—but it's a good idea to do so. This will greatly discourage further shipments to you from the same company.





- 1/4 cup finely chopped onion
- 1 bay leaf, crushed
- 3/4 cup chicken broth or water

Saute chicken livers in butter until just done, about 4 minutes. Remove from pan and chop. Saute celery, green pepper, onion and bay leaf until tender. Add broth, bring to a boil, remove from heat and toss with stuffing and chopped chicken livers. Makes 6 servings. Double recipe for 16-pound turkey. Use as stuffing for roast chicken, Cornish hen, summer squash or eggplant.
