Veto Sale of Beechwood School

Electors Approve \$7.8 Million School Budget for 1989-90

Attendance at Monday night's Annual School District Meeting was one of the lowest in the past four years. Approximately 55 electors were all that showed up to cast their votes on three major issues which affect the entire school district community. The first issue being the approval of the proposed 1989-90 budget of over \$7.8 million, second, the setting of the tax levy and third, the fate of the closed Beechwood School property.

Despite the fact that next year's budget will mean an increase of 13.02% in the tax levy over this year, there was little discussion or questions following Business Manager Cherna Gorder's presentation. Gorder told those attending the meeting, that while the budget itself had only increased 3.5% or \$266,000 over last year, losses in revenues for the coming year were a major factor in a double-digit levy increase. General State Aid for the

1.6% or over \$50,000. That, along with the fact that there is some question as to what size increase, if any, the district will see in its equalized value are the determining factors which establish the levy. Based on no increase in the equalized value over last year, the 1989-90 levy will be \$15.69 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation. On a \$70,000 home, that would represent a tax increase of \$126.70. fortunate enough to see at least a 5% increase in its equalized value, the levy could drop to \$14.94, which would reflect an increase of \$74.20 on that same \$70,000 home.

Gorder said the question of the district's new equalized value could not be answered until October when the state officially releases its figures.

While action on the budget had a greater impact on the school district and its tax-payers, it was the Beechwood School and its fate which, as in past meetings, received the bulk of the evening's discussion by both the electors and school board members.

There were three resolutions directly concerning the school; seeking board authorization to sell the property, authorization to lease it and authorization to allow the school to be used for community purposes.

In addressing the issue, board member Perry Ankerson asked how much it was costing the district just to maintain the property. Administrator David Heather said it was running between \$8,000 and \$8,500 a year.

Ankerson also asked Heather how much it would cost the district to re-open and make the school operational and whether enrollment projections would warrant opening the school in the next two to three years. Heather said costs to reestablish the school would run \$175,000 between \$250,000, including staffing. As far as a need to open the school, Heather indicated enrollment projections showed a continued decrease.

Jerry Secor, Town of Farmington, told the board he hadn't heard any figures as to what it would cost to build extra classrooms if the school was sold and enrollments began to increase. Ankerson said, "even if the school district grows, you have to ask what chance we will have to have major growth in Beechwood." He noted parents would probably not look favorably on having their children bussed from one side of the district to the other.

Maurice Hovland, Town of Kewaskum, indicated he had no major opinion for or against selling the school. "I feel this issue is based solely on emotion," said Hovland. He did say, however, that at a special meeting on the school three years ago, a motion was made and approved that Beechwood would not be sold for five years. "I would like to see that motion upheld for at least two more years," said Hovland, "if for no other reason that it shows the district respects their (the voters') opinion."

There was also some question as to whether the Town of Scott board would allow the property to be re-zoned if a prospective buyer wanted to use it for something other than a school or institution.

When all was said and done, the resolution to sell the school failed with 36 voting 'no' and 19 voting 'yes.'

The next resolution concerning authorization to lease the property, however, passed on a 31-23 vote. Janet Hubbell, of Kewaskum, questioned the board about the district still having the expenses previously incurred if it were leased and administration of the property according to an article she had read in Monday's West Bend News.

Lee Rammer, of Beechwood, responded to Hubbell saying the News' article was not accurate. He said his only was to intention be administrator of a fund to meet the expenses incurred, strictly as a community service so that the residents could continue to use the school. Rammer said several individuals had indicated they were willing to donate money to meet those costs and he had offered to handle their administration. "I have no interest in the property as a business," said Rammer.

On a 46-6 vote, the district was also authorized to allow the use of the school for community purposes.

Along with the routine resolutions approved for the normal operations of the district, the voters also authorized the board to borrow \$200,000 for capital improvement projects during the 1989-90 school year. The nine projects, not included in the general budget, ranged from roof repairs to asbestos removal.

With no objections from the floor, the date for the 1990 Annual Meeting was set for the fourth Monday in July.

Scored 'Above Standard' in Reading Test

95% of School District's Third Graders

The School District of Kewaskum has received the results of the third grade reading test taken by the district's third graders last April. Test results indicate that the third graders of the Kewaskum School District scored very well in relation to other third grade students across the state.

The test is based on the student's comprehension of 31 questions and is scored by indicating the student scored "below the standard," "at the standard," or "above the standard." The cut off scores for each grading criteria were established by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction.

Test results indicate that 95% of the Kewaskum third grade students who took the test scored "above the standard." The state average for students scoring "above the standard" was 87.5%. Four percent of the Kewaskum students taking the test scored "at the standard" and one percent of the Kewaskum third graders scored "below the standard." In comparison, the statewide averages for these two categories were "at standard" 7.6% and "below standard" 4.8%.

The reading test results indicate the district's reading program K-3 is doing well and we can be proud of the efforts of our children, their parents and their teachers.

Plan The Kewaskum Commission reviewed a petition for annexation Tuesday evening and its members voted to recommend that a temporary R-2 zoning of 14 properties along the Town of Kewaskum side of Bonnie Lane be passed on to the Village Board for approval at its next meeting.

Following that action the commission voted recommend a permanent R-2 residential zoning for those properties. Zoning Administrator Richard Zarling advised the commission that it could make both the temporary and permanent zoning recommendations at the same time since all the lots involved in the petition have construction (homes) on them that fall into the R-2 category. What the temporary zoning simply does is allow a municipality up to a year to make a final decision on zoning in the event there is a chance there will be a change in the land usage. In this case, noted Zarling, since all the properties already fall into the residential classification, a recommendation for the permanent zoning can be made immediately.

Paul Blumer Chairman informed the commission's members that the annexation petition had been made to the village because of problems with septic systems which no longer meet DNR standards. Annexation of the properties will allow the owners to hook up to the village's sewer and water

As part of the recommendation, all the property owners

will be required to provide plat maps which will be used to help the village's engineers lay out the laterals, said Zarling. The entire cost of the construction will be paid for by the property owners.

The subject of sidewalks will have to be addressed by the Village Board as a separate item at a later date due to the fact that not all the owners in the affected area signed the petition. If they had, noted Zarling, there would have been no problem making a decision on sidewalk installation too.





When they were built in the late 1880's by Rosenheimer Brothers, the buildings pictured above must have added a sense of job security to Kewaskum residents. The business was incorporated in 1891 and the name was changed to L. Rosenheimer Malt and Grain Company. The brothers chose the name to honor their father, the first L. Rosenheimer. The building on the left was the elevator; the low part, the malt house; the tall buildings contained the kilns; the three large storage tanks were usually used for storing malt. In September of 1911 the elevator burned to the ground with some damage to the malt house. The elevator was rebuilt to the south of its original location. Glacier Processing now occupies the building.



Wisconsin Electric Celebrates First 'Smart Money' Milestone

MILWAUKEE - A celebration for customers who did not use too much electricity, for bills that did not go up and for a power plant that was not built was held July 18th by Wisconsin Electric Power Co.

Security Laminate Improved For Driver's Licenses **And Identification Cards**

A new plastic laminate, designed for better legibility and to help prevent alterations is now being used on Wisconsin driver licenses and identification cards.

The announcement was made by Norbert K. Anderson, administrator of the state Department of Transportation's Division of Motor Vehicles, who said that the switch is being made in response to comments by the public, law enforcement agencies and others that the licenses and identification cards were occasionally difficult to read because of the intensity of the security feature in the previous laminate.

The new laminate has a latent image of two columns of the words "Wisconsin" printed down the middle of the license separated by an outline of the state. The latent image overlays part of the person's photo and the printed data on the driver's license or identification card.

Any attempt to cut out the photo to replace it with another, or to alter any of the letters or numbers will disrupt the latent image and void the license or identification card.

The latent-image technology has been developing rapidly in the wake of a nationwide 21 drinking age, because driver's licenses are the uniform means of identification and proof of age, Anderson said. "We're trying to make it difficult to change the birthdate or any other feature on the license without it being obvious to a trained observer," he added.

Habitat for Humanity Work Crew Returns Home from Zanesville Project

The Habitat for Humanity work crew from Peace United Church of Christ returned to Kewaskum Saturday, July 15 after a 1140 mile round trip over eight days, to build for the poor in Zanesville, Ohio.

One new house and yard was completed and is being occupied, three sites were cleared of growth and debris for future new housing, and one older home was completely stripped inside and rewired for renovation. The latter project included the brick-by-brick removal of four fireplaces, the original heating and cooking source for the home. Richard Moore, Habitat project leader for the week in Zanesville, praised the Kewaskum team as the hardest working and most productive crew Zanesville has yet had. Moore, a retired insurance executive, spends many days each month as a Habitat volunteer. He was at the work site to coordinate labor each day.

Moore and his wife are also active volunteers at "Christ's Table," a daily meal program at St. John's ALC Lutheran Church of Zanesville, where 300-400 people are served a nourishing noon meal for a cost of 25c per person. Everyone who comes to the "Table" is fed, regardless of ability to give a donation. The dollar per day per person paid voluntarily by the Kewaskum workers who joined the "Table" each noon therefore fed three hungry people besides themselves. Rev. Donald Worth of Zanesville Central Presbyterian Church arranged for the work crew to eat with and come to know the "Table" group as friends. The Habitat crew was housed at the Presbyterian Church. Breakfasts and evening meals were cooked by work team members Marion Erdmann, Ruth Gruhle, and Betty Bettin at that church.

The unemployment rate in Zanesville is extremely high, and the need for affordable, non-interest homes to be purchased through Habitat is vital for those who do have low-income jobs. Young adults sleeping on streets and the riverbank all year is a major problem, Moore stressed. although the crime rate is lower than average. The Appalachian poor represent an economic challenge to state and local government in Ohio and churches step in to meet that challenge most effectively.

In addition to the Habitat cooks, other workers included Bret Rauch, Robert Schreffler, Shannon, Susan, Pat, and Patrick McFadden, Darlene and Wayland Tessar, Richard Zarling, Willard Gruhle, Connie and Howard Zemlicka, Steve and Chris Romans, Karen Kletti, Marlene Domasky, Kevin Hinz, Brian Goetsch, Courtney Sparks, Jennifer Stelter, and Rev. James Bettin.

Seven members of the team also worked for Habitat in Nashville, Tennessee in 1987 and Buffalo, New York in 1988. Seven others are two year veterans. A project for 1990 has not yet been chosen, but work team members at the Peace Church service on Sunday, July 16 expressed desires to take part in a fourth venture. Dirt, poison ivy, heat and humidity in the high 90's did not dampen

work enthusiasm for the team as a whole.

Peace Church members not actively building offer monetary support for transportation, food, and materials for the crew. \$800.00 was presented to the Zanesville project by Peace Church to purchase building supplies for Habitat. One tenth of all such gifts is tithed for a foreign project where a Habitat house costs only one-tenth as much to build.







Addresses UW Board of Regents On Non-Traditional Age Students

WEST BEND - At age 47. Elizabeth Collins of West Bend just finished three years as a non-traditional age student here at the University of Wisconsin Center - Washington County. Recently she was selected to address the UW Board of Regents on behalf of all non-traditional age students attending the system's 13 freshman-sophomore campuses.

In July at Richland Center, Collins told the Regents about the impact her studies have made on her, her husband Dan and their three children ages 20 to 26. She admitted that Dan, a toolroom machinist for 27 years, "sometimes speaks longingly of his old life and his old wife.

She added, "I think he dreams of rhubarb pie, homemade chocolate cookies and not eating leftovers. Frankly, so do I sometimes."

Collins described her life before college to the Regents. "It was a wonderful life," she said, and included taking care of the family, driving a school bus, baby sitting, volunteering, singing in the church choir, raising horses, feeding chickens, milking goats, organic gardening and various other hobbies.

'Now," she told the regents, "I do almost none of those things but have found another wonderful life...I have had the opportunity start

completely new career, have have a second chance at a college education - a chance that did not exist for me at 18 a chance to become almost a new person.'

About a third of the students at UWWC and the other freshman-sophomore centers are in the non-traditional age group. Collins explained why at Richland Center. She said, "In my family and social world, young women, after graduating from high school, worked at a job, lived at home, and then married and 'settled down' to raise a family.

But according to Collins, raising children began to fuel her interest in "going to college and learning things." Her interest grew when one son dropped out of college and another showed little interest in schooling. She told the Regents that she began to think "if I could 'start again,' maybe my sons would realize someday that they could do the same thing."

In her talk at Richland Center, Collins talked about what it was like to return to school. "At first I was terrified," she said. "A large campus was completely out of the question. I simply could not have done it. For me it was attend the Washington County Center or never go to college. So I enrolled for six credits.

What was it like? "It was not easy," Collins reported to the classes I shook so hard I could not take notes. I cried when I had my first written assignment because I didn't know where to write my name, and it took me three days to figure out three pages of philosophy.'

But Collins moved beyond this early period to win a major scholarship during her first year at UWWC. Last May, she won a second top scholarship for her junior and senior years at UW-Milwukee, where she is majoring in comparative history.

In her address to the Regents, Collins sought to alert the UW leaders to the importance of her age group. She said, "As a nontraditional student, I represent a growing number of people entering your two year centers across the state.

"We are the students who stay in their communities, raise their families, and work part-time or full-time jobs.

"We are the students who often work harder, contribute more in your classrooms and take learning more seriously than many younger students."

'Ve are the ones who serve as role models for those who -Like me - may have never been on a college campus, or who were interrupted ten, twenty or more years before and who say to themselves, I would, I should, maybe I could have a second chance, too."

Collins calls herself "a University of Wisconsin Centers success story" and credits what has happened to UWWC. She admitted to the Regents "that if it had not been for the small, two year campus in West Bend, I would not have started my new life." And she spelled out exactly how it happened for her. - "The campus was close to

Regents. "The first week of home so I was able to remain active in my community.'

> -"The classes were small enough so I was not afraid to speak in class.'

> -"The professors were not knowledgeable and accessible but people who got to know me and my interests. They encouraged me to reach beyond what I thought were my expectations and capabilities.'

Collins said she is very pleased that all of her credits have transferred due to "the solid curriculum," at UWWC. She said, "Although I still feel a little frightened, I know I am academically well prepared."

She told the Regents about one "unique opportunity" of returning to school in her forties sharing college life with her daughter. "At home we were mother and daughter," she said, "but at school we were academic peers."

The pair did have some agreements about how to conduct themselves at UWWC. When they were in the same classroom, Collins said, they did not sit together. "And I was not to turn around and give her 'mother looks' and she was not to yell, 'Hey, Ma!' down the

Collins educational dreams don't stop with a four-year degree. "After earning my B.A., she said "I hope either to teach older adults or enter law school. As society ages, I believe there will be an increased need for various forms of adult learning. As a 'non-trad' myself - I could offer encouragement."



What Is The Game? Players choose six numbers between 1-54. Each \$1 ticket contains two plays, so players would select two different sets of numbers on a \$1 ticket. MEGABUCKS will offer Quick Picks (computer randomly selects numbers for player) and will allow players to purchase tickets for up to two draws at one time. If the player buys a ticket on Friday, he/she may have the ticket good for the drawing Saturday night and the following Wednesday. The cost is two plays for \$1 per drawing.

If Wisconsin sells 30 per cent of the tickets in a drawing, it is obligated to fund 30 per cent of the prize pool paid in that game.

Recycling Hazardous Waste Into Safe Products

CAPE TOWN-Historic. charming Cape Town, at the very tip of Africa, has one of the most beautiful settings in the world.

The Dutch fell in love with the location when they settled here, to begin the development of a vast, largely uninhabited area which was to become the Union of South Africa.
