Master gardener training to be held in county

WEST BEND- Interested in learning how to better manage your yard and gardens and share your gained knowledge with others through volunteer activities? If so, then the University of Wisconsin Extension Master Gardener Volunteer Program may be for you.

The training classes will be held on 12 consecutive Tuesday evenings from February 9 to April 27 from 6 to 9 p.m. in West Bend. Cost of the program is \$135.00, which includes printed materials and a copy of the: Handbook for Wisconsin Gardeners.

To become a Certified Master Gardener, participants must attend the classes, complete the final exam and volunteer time back to the community in a horticultural related project.

The general class is intended to be introductory, covering a wide range of horticultural topics including: Plant Propagation, Entomology, Annuals and Perennials, Weeds and Pests, Native Plants, Invasive Plants, Vegetable Crops, Plant Pathology, Soils and Fertil-

ity, Woody Landscape Plants, Backyard Wildlife, Fruit Crops, and Turf Management. The classes are presented using live interactive video conferences. University of Wisconsin horticultural faculty and other specialists will be providing the instruction.

If interested, you are encouraged to attend an information meeting regarding the Master Gardener Program on January 12th from 7 to 8 p.m., at the UW Extension office in the Washington County Public Agency Center at 333 E Washington Street (enter building from the south side).

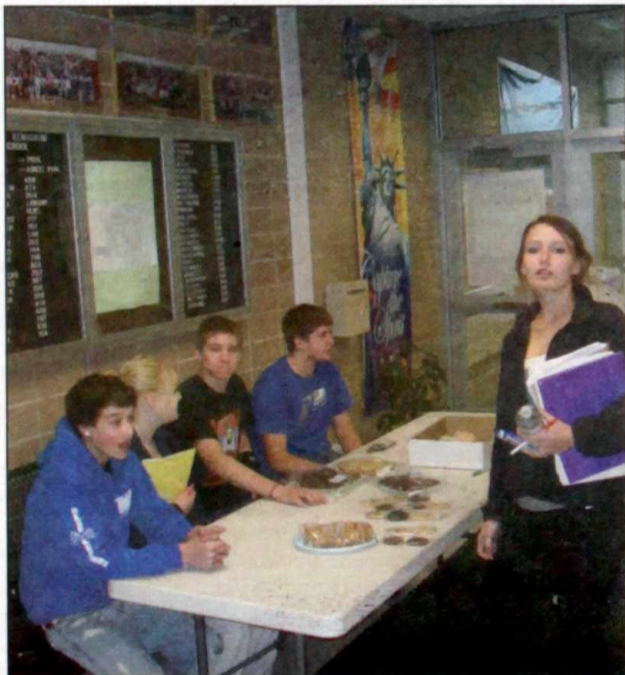

Seibel saluted for 100 wins; Indians roll over Plymouth

KEWASKUM- Propelled by six pins and a major decision, the Kewaskum's wrestling team rolled over Plymouth 61-9 last Tuesday in the team's home opener against its Eastern Wisconsin Conference (EWC) foe.

With the win, the Indians improved to 4-2 overall, and they are 1-1 in the EWC.

The meet was especially memorable for senior Cody Seibel, who was honored for being the newest member of the 100-win club. With his pin in 1:15 over Clint Wyatt at 285 pounds — he moved up a weight class to get a match — Seibel has 105 victories and is in position to become Kewaskum's winningest wrestler.

"I wouldn't have moved Cody up, but I just wanted him to have a match," KHS coach Dennis Aupperle said, explaining he wanted to be able to announce at a home meet that Seibel is over 100.

Seibel's actual 100th victory came Dec. 5 at the Spartan Duals in Luxemburg against Mosinee.

"He's on his way to the record if he stays healthy," Aupperle said, noting Scott Rhoads, the Indians' only 2-time state champion, is currently No. 1 at KHS with 134 wins, followed by Joel Dziedzic, the KHS assistant coach, who had 132, and P.J. Krueger, who wound up with 130.

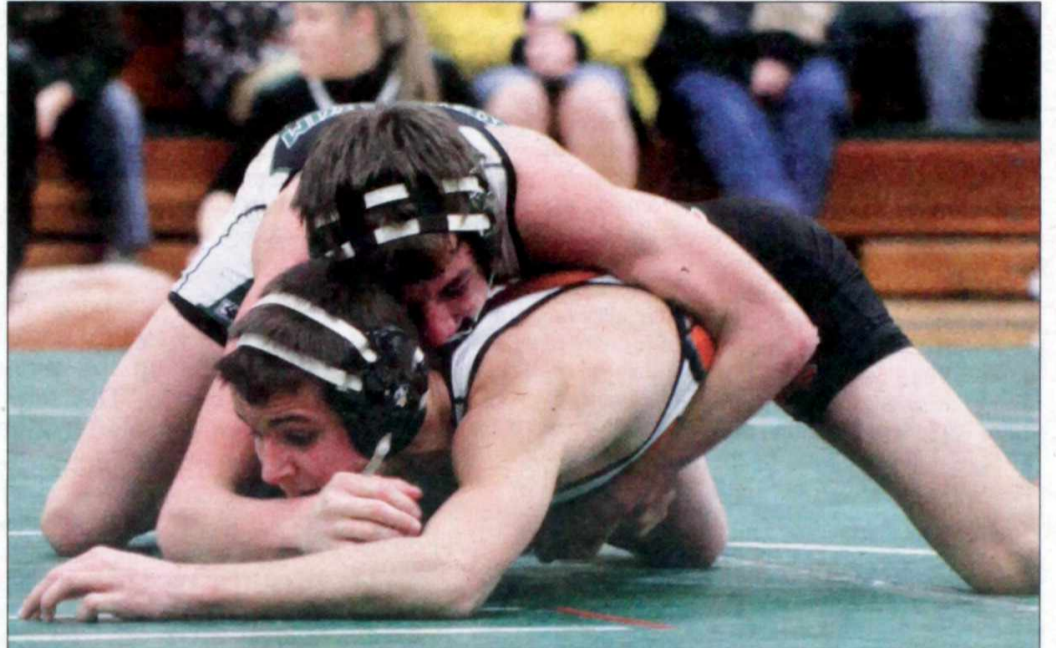
Seibel is currently 7-0 on the year.

"The kids did a good job," Aupperle said concerning the lopsided victory. "We got off to a good start with Austin (Goeden) and Jared (Koffke)."

In the first match of the night, the freshman Goeden pinned junior Dan Uribe in 4:50, and Koffke followed with a solid 4-0 win over Colin Rortvedt, who is perhaps the Panthers' best wrestler. Koffke scored a reversal in the second period and took Rortvedt down with a single leg drop in the third for his points.

Next Kewaskum picked up a forfeit at 135, followed by pins by Rob Maertz and Brad Bentz for a 27-0 lead. Later Bo Seibel and Cole Roberts had back-to-back wins, via pin and a major decision, and the Indians concluded the match with Derik Muckerheide's pin at 119.

With this meet, Bo Seibel is 6-1; Bentz, 4-0; Maertz, 5-2;

Indians endure Waupun wallop

KEWASKUM- Kewaskum's boys' basketball team is looking for a bounce back Tuesday night after taking it on the chin twice in a row, once from one of the best teams in the conference and the other one of the best in the state.

The latest blowout came last Thursday at home from Waupun, one of the top-ranked teams in Division 2. The Warriors won 72-46 to improve to 7-0 overall and 3-0 in the Eastern Wisconsin Conference (EWC).

Kewaskum fell to 2-4 on the season, 1-2 in the EWC.

Thursday's game was over not long after Waupun's point guard lined up for the jump ball. And won it.

At 6-foot-3, Austin Armga, last year's conference player of the year, has more ups, quickness and moves than many his size, not to mention shooting ability. He scored 32 points on 12-for-18 shooting, 3-for-6 on three-pointers, in a little more than 20 minutes.

He outscored Kewaskum's entire team in the first quarter, 12-11 and in the third, 7-6.

"Armga gets a lot of the credit. You could take Armga out of the game, but then you got (Cory) Nickel that's going to beat you and the (Derrick) Winterhack kid's going to beat you. They've really got four really good starters that would be first-team all conference probably if they had more stats," said Kewaskum Coach Quinn Heintz.

The Indians struggled with the Warriors' press as turnovers led to easy scores. In the half-court set, Waupun used its quickness and ball handling to break down Kewaskum's defense.

"They're just a good team," Heintz said. "They all get the ball up the floor and they all can finish. Any one of those guys can be a starter on any team in the league."

Mat Toles led Kewaskum with 13 points and nine rebounds. Eric Perkins added 10.

The Warriors took a 38-24 halftime lead and then dominated the third quarter, 21-6. Armga only played a few minutes in the second half but managed 13 points on 5-for-6 shooting.

Kewaskum tried a zone defense to start the third quarter. It didn't last long.

"We were just hoping to try to slow the pace down a little bit," Heintz said. "They scored every possession we were in zone. They took 40 seconds but they were still scoring. We were just trying to get the pace down because we were tired."

Heintz liked the first 16 minutes

but knows a fix is needed for the next 16.

"I thought we competed well in the first half. We made some mistakes and they took advantage," he said. "In the second half we kind of came out flat again. We've been doing that ... And maybe we get tired. We're not very deep."

"We're going to have to find a way over Christmas to find a way to finish better in the second half," he said.

The Indians get the chance to start finding a solution before Christmas. After being beat by Plymouth, 67-40, and then Waupun, Kewaskum hosts Sheboygan Falls, finally a team not picked to contend for the conference title.

"And that's a big game for us. We want to be a program that finishes in the top half of the conference and the winner of that game will have a shot to do that this year," Heintz said. "Those are the types of games that in the past we've struggled in and this year we're trying to say we've turned the corner and this are the types of teams that we're going to need to beat."
